- 3. TWO-PAGE, DOUBLE-SPACED ESSAY ON ONE OF THE FOLLOWING TOPICS:
 - The prohibition on cabotage (the movement of domestic cargo between points in the United States by a foreign carrier) has been the law of the land since 1920. While applicable to all modes of transportation, it is primarily associated with the maritime industry. Critics say it is an outmoded law that increases transportation costs to Hawaii, Alaska, Puerto Rico, and U.S. territories in the Pacific Ocean and should be repealed. Supporters argue that doing so would put the safety and survival of U.S. citizens in those areas at risk. Take a position for or against repealing maritime cabotage in the United States.
 - Panama is experiencing an unprecedented lack of rain that is forcing the government to limit the
 daily number of ships permitted to transit the Panama Canal. What impacts is the situation having
 on ship operators and cargo owners accustomed to moving through the canal? What other options
 are available? What, if anything, is the Panamanian government doing to address the problem?
 - Major geopolitical issues have erupted recently around the world. Discuss some of these concerns and how they are impacting the maritime industry and supply chains in general.
